

Educational Session Presentation Styles

- a. Traditional Presentation – As in the past, these are educational sessions in which the presenter(s) shares information with a theater-style audience. Presenters may include media (e.g., PowerPoint, video) and sessions generally consist of a presentation followed by time for questions and answers.
- b. Special Interest Forum – The Special Interest Forum (SIF), led by a facilitator, is a round table discussion during which attendees may discuss a specific topic of interest in a small group setting. This format should maximize the opportunity for open dialogue between conference attendees, as participants share their experience and thoughts. Think about your topic of interest and discussion questions you would integrate. No Audio Visual equipment will be provided for Special Interest Forums.
- c. Panel – Not interested in presenting a session or facilitating a round table discussion? Consider serving as a member of a panel. Panels will ideally have three to four participants and a moderator. Potential panelists should submit topics of expertise and related experience; final panels will be determined based on content demand and depth of expertise.
